


How To Edit an Existing Program

To edit an existing program you will need to login to your account via <http://www.nmstemconnection.org/user>. From your user welcome screen you will be able to see all the programs (both published and unpublished) that are associated with your user account. You will also see a link to directly edit each program.

Another way to access the edit screen of a program is (once you are logged in) when you visit a program you are the administrator of you will see 'View' and 'Edit' Buttons located above the title of the program.



Once you click on 'Edit' you will be taken to a screen that will allow you to make changes to all the fields for your program. Once you are satisfied with your changes, you will need to scroll to the bottom of the page and click 'Save'.
